Dear Friends and Colleagues,

The first quarter of the 21st century is wrapping up in a time of considerable social, technologic, and political change. The once “disruptive innovation” of formal postgraduate residency and fellowship training for nurse practitioners and physician assistants/associates is now well established in both primary care and specialty care. In large part due to the pioneering work of the Consortium and its many partners, there is a strong basis for ensuring quality, and excellence in postgraduate training that will directly and positively impact access to high quality health care in the U.S. for decades to come. The Consortium is making a significant contribution to ensuring an expertly prepared, resilient, and committed workforce that must grow in sheer numbers as well as expertise to meet the healthcare needs of the people of the U.S.

Thanks to the leadership of our Executive Director Kerry Bamrick and her associate, Shay Felder, with the tremendous support of individuals across the country who have committed their volunteer time and expertise, the Consortium is now the only Department of Education federally recognized accrediting organization for NP postgraduate training programs and joint NP-PA postgraduate training programs. From my vantage point as a non-voting member of the Accreditation Commission, the development of the Accreditation Standards over the years has had its intended impact: tremendous rigor

and consistency in the underlying structural elements and standards for postgraduate training for new NPs and PAs, expressed in the context of the unique needs and attributes of the sponsoring organization and the patients/communities they care for.

I want to thank our Board of Directors for their strategic guidance, our Accreditation Commission for their time and expertise in reviewing and rendering all Accreditation decisions independently, and our incredible Membership Committee that builds community and connection among individuals and organizations through our annual conference and our year-round virtual convenings. Big thanks to the MWHS that provides the “just in time” corporate services (finance, IT, communications, etc.) that make it possible for the Consortium’s lean staff to focus on the essentials of accreditation, membership support, and growth of APP postgraduate training programs in the U.S.

By the numbers? Since the launch of the 1st postgraduate residency training program in 2007, the movement has grown to include 550 programs of both specialty and primary care, 259 programs that are primary care only, and of those the majority are found in community health centers and Veteran Affairs centers. CAPP’s accredited programs alone count 980 alums of their rigorous programs.

Every year, I comment on the tremendous changes underway that impact health and healthcare. The Consortium for Advanced Practice Provider and the people who make it happen have my deepest respect for their ability to grow and change based on new knowledge and opportunities, while maintaining an unwavering commitment to their north star of preparing tomorrow’s healthcare providers through rigor and excellence in postgraduate training.

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Executive Director Report

We're approaching our anniversary! Ten years ago this coming July, the Consortium became a formal 501c3 Organization.

Because I wanted to see how the Consortium has changed in the past decade, I looked at our first Annual Report, published in 2016. In describing our young start-up, words like *nimble* and *robust* jumped out at me. So did important accomplishments, including publishing an accreditation infrastructure for postgraduate NP training programs, and the publication of accreditation standards. We also launched a website, which almost immediately began attracting queries from APP Postgraduate training programs across the country.

I couldn't be more proud of our beginnings, and of the Consortium's many achievements in just 10 years. A vibrant organization, we continue to evolve as our nation's healthcare needs and priorities change. But who we are, our DNA, if you will, has never changed. As we continue to grow and invest in you, our community, we're always looking ahead at our constantly shifting healthcare landscape.

As NPs and PAs increasingly become the backbone of primary care practice and essential providers in specialty, acute and in-patient care, there is an urgent need to ensure that they 1) have access to appropriate postgraduate training—beyond that required for licensure—appropriate to the setting and needs of different areas of practice such as FQHC or acute care settings and 2) that the public perception, understanding and recognition of that role, training, and competencies of these groups of health care providers is shaped by a new marketing/public awareness campaign.

Postgraduate programs for APPs are proliferating rapidly. At the end of 2024, there were 549 training programs for APPs, across 48 states.

The Consortium is meeting the challenges presented by this revolution in healthcare. From our beginnings a decade ago, we have set the standards for APP Postgraduate training, an indispensable bridge between education and practice. To date, the Consortium has accredited 38 training programs and as 2024 ended, we had 19 additional programs waiting to be either become accredited or re-accredited, our largest increase yet in accreditation activities.

As we continue to move forward, our ideas and growth continue to be endorsed by the Federal government. In 2024, with Department of Education approval, the Consortium became the only federally recognized accreditor to accredit joint NP/PA postgraduate training programs.

We know that 2025 may be a year of increasing complexity in healthcare in our country. I want to reassure everyone that I remain focused on the work and ensuring the Consortium is a place of stability and support for our consortium members. We are here to support you.

In this new year, please join with us for this exciting period in healthcare. A great start would be to attend our Annual Conference, July 13-15, in Denver, CO, the city where the Consortium held its first conference. We promise it will be a time to learn, grow, and make meaningful connections.

With your help, the Consortium has grown so much. But some things haven't changed, as this sentence from our first Annual Report shows: *Our goal is to connect with members and accredited programs and advance postgraduate training as it achieves and maintains the highest standards of rigor and quality.*

2024 Updates

Accreditation:

Three Postgraduate APP training programs received initial accreditation, ten programs received renewal of accreditation, and there are nineteen programs in the accreditation pipeline for initial accreditation and five programs for renewal of accreditation in 2025. [Details on page 4-5.](#)

Membership and Membership Community Forums:

In 2024, our network of postgraduate NP, PA, and joint NP/PA residency and fellowship programs and professionals grew and increased by 13% since 2023. The Consortium currently has 366 members across 48 states (numbers are from December Board Membership Meeting).

The Membership site, Community Forums, Resource Library, and Regional Membership Meetings provided a platform for our membership community to network, share resources, and collaborate on best practices, fostering innovation and growth within postgraduate training programs. New in 2024, the Consortium started hosting monthly Accreditation Office Hours, where postgraduate APP programs can ask questions, seek guidance, and gain insights into the accreditation process, ensuring continuous support and clarity for program success.

Seventh Annual Conference—“Collaboration, Support and Community in Postgraduate APP Training”

Our 2024 Conference was held on July 21-23, 2023 in San Diego, CA. New in 2024, we offered an Administration and Operations Pre-Conference Workshop. Both the Pre-conference workshop and 2-day conference were a major success! **Of the 200 conference attendees, 100% of the evaluation respondents stated they were “strongly satisfied” or “satisfied” with all dimensions of the 7th Annual Conference.** [See story on page 6-9.](#)

National Webinars, Training and other Offerings:

To ensure engagement and value to membership we responded to our members requests and provided the following offerings in 2024:

- Developed the national listing of postgraduate APP programs, where there are now 549 Postgraduate APP Training programs nationwide (as of 12/31/24).
- Provided an intense, two-day accreditation site visitor training course for new site visitors
- Explored hosting a universal matching program for APP Postgraduate training candidates and programs
- Launched a national survey aimed at gathering foundational data on Postgraduate APP training program salaries and support—results coming in 2024!
- Published an article in the *Journal of Medical Science* in April 2024 on “A National Survey on Support for Nurse Practitioner and Physician Assistant/Associate Postgraduate Fellowship/Residency Programs and Director Compensation”
- Published an article in the *Journal of Medical Science* on “An Analysis of Trainee Salaries Offered in Nurse Practitioner and Physician Assistant/Associate Postgraduate Residency and Fellowship Programs in the United States”

The Consortium receives Federal Recognition by the U.S. Department of Education for its Expansion of Scope Petition to include the accreditation of joint Nurse Practitioner and Physician Assistant/Associate Postgraduate Training programs to its existing federal recognition status.

The Consortium has worked diligently to achieve Federal recognition for its Expansion of Scope from the U.S. Department of Education. With this achievement, we are able to expand our work in education and health care to support the next generation of advanced practice providers. Attaining this recognition not only speaks to the quality and rigor of our accreditation process, but it is also a testament to the synergy of minds that came together to achieve something greater for health care and for our patients.

The Consortium is proud to receive the U.S. Department of Education’s federal recognition and deeply appreciates the role it plays in assuring that APP postgraduate training programs meet the highest standards for quality and impact. We are honored to serve the public as a federally recognized accrediting agency ensuring our nation’s advanced practice providers are prepared to meet the challenge of providing health care to people of all ages in communities in every corner of our country.



Accreditation Activity in 2024



We continue to solidify our national position as the accreditor of postgraduate NP, PA and joint NP/PA residency and fellowship training programs. We serve the public and our stakeholders by accrediting these APP Postgraduate programs and publishing the outcomes of those reviews. We pride ourselves on the consistent quality of our professional yet collegial approach to ensuring a rigorous, voluntary, peer-review accreditation process.

In 2024, three programs received initial accreditation: **Open Door Community Health Center's** Advanced Practice Clinician Residency in Eureka, CA; **Lamprey Health Care's** Family Nurse Practitioner Fellowship in Raymond, NH; and **AltaMed Health Services Corporation's** Nurse Practitioner Fellowship in Commerce, CA. Ten programs received renewal of accreditation: **Community Health Center's** Nurse Practitioner Residency in Family Practice and Community Health and **Community Health Center's** Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner Residency, both in Middletown, CT; **Community Healthcare Network's** Nurse Practitioner Fellowship and **Community Healthcare Network's** Psychiatric Nurse Practitioner Fellowship, both in New York, NY; **El Rio Health's** Advanced Practice Registered Nurse Residency Program in Tucson, AZ; **HealthLinc's** Family Nurse Practitioner Residency Program in Valparaiso, IN; **International Community Health Services' Advanced Practice Provider Residency Program** in Seattle, WA; **Petaluma Health Center's** Nurse Practitioner/Physician Assistant Residency Program in Petaluma, CA; and **Urban Health Plan's** Nurse Practitioner/Physician Assistant Residency Program in Bronx, NY.

Nineteen programs are in the accreditation pipeline for initial accreditation and five programs for renewal of accreditation in 2025.

7th Annual Conference 2024: Collaboration, Support, and Community

The seventh annual Consortium Conference, **Collaboration, Support, and Community**, took place in-person on Monday, July 22 and Tuesday, July 23, 2024 in San Diego, CA. This two-day CME-approved conference included keynote speakers, panel presentations, breakout sessions, and exhibitors, and provided the opportunity for a specialized focus on critical elements of curriculum, evaluation, faculty development, and accreditation. The two-day event brought together 200+ participants to learn from each other and also from experts in healthcare systems and policy and Postgraduate NP and joint NP/PA training. Continuing in 2024, the Consortium offered three Pre-Conference Workshops on Preceptor Fundamentals, Preceptor Mastery, and an Administration and Operations track on Sunday, July 21st. 78 Preceptors participated in the Preceptor Workshops led by Radha Denmark, DNP, FNP-C, FHM, and 55 participants attended the Administration and Operations Workshop based on a variety of topics (see below). The workshops were so successful that we will be returning the Preceptor Development and Administration/Operations Workshops at the 2025 conference in Denver, CO as well as launching a NEW Leadership Pre-Conference Workshop.

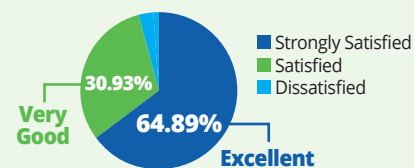

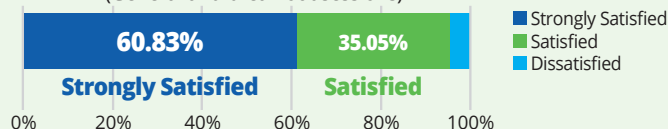
